COVID

As with all schools across the country, we have seen a high number of absences due to COVID this week. This is in both children and staff. Thanks to parents who ensured that children had COVID tests before they returned we have not seen any onsite cases yet. As a reminder children should not attend school if they have



- A high temperature
- Loss of taste or smell

They should instead get a PCR test and isolate until they receive the results.

We are all expecting that the next few weeks will be challenging. The rates of COVID in Trafford have never been higher and this inevitably becomes cases in school, both of children and staff. You have been absolutely fantastic in supporting us in keeping our community safe throughout this pandemic and I know that we can be assured of your support moving forward.







TRANSPORT

The Local Authority transport solutions are being adversely effected by COVID and staff being required to isolate. School staff are stepping in a passenger assistants to ensure that children can get to school, however this does mean that route times change. We are working really hard with transport to let you now in advance when things will be different, however this is changing on an hourly basis so please be patient with both us and the transport team. I can assure you we are doing our absolute best. If there are any parents who are able to transport their own children at this time, please get in touch with the transport team as they would very much appreciate your help.

ATTENDANCE

Can I remind parents to please ensure they contact school should their child be absent for any reason. The school office is open from 8am. Where we are unable to make contact with a family by 11am on the first day of absence a home visit will be completed to check that everyone is ok. If following a home visit we are still concerned, ie, there is no answer at the door then school may request a safe and well check is completed by the Police. We work in this way following the death of Chadrack Mulo, a young boy with autism, who was unable to seek help after his mum passed away in their home.
